## Emergency Preparedness - Loss of Cooling

In the event of mechanical breakdown resulting in a loss of cooling particularly in warmer weather, procedures are in place to minimize the impact on residents. Residents can assist to keep the building as cool as possible by keeping windows securely closed when the temperature outside is 25° C or warmer. Keeping window coverings closed during daylight hours will help to keep the suite from heating up from the sun.

Residents should dress lightly, turn off unnecessary lights, and may be moved to the coolest area of the building, which may be the basement. Cool liquids will be provided to residents throughout the day.

In the event the situation cannot be resolved for a longer period of time, the Foundation may request that residents contact a family member to stay with until the situation is resolved.
