#### 3.2 Security and Fire Protection:

For the security of the Resident and others in the Premises, the Resident must ensure that they only admit guests to the Premises that they are acquainted with and take responsibility for.

### SafeWalk Initiative

The downtown Watch program has expanded to include a SafeWalk Service in the downtown area that provides escorted walks to and from any location within the Watch patrol zone. The service is available between the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. daily.

To request a SafeWalk, please contact The Watch at (403) 755-WALK (9255). The nearest team of volunteers will be dispatched to your location and will escort you to your destination.



## **Emergency Preparedness - Release of Dangerous Goods**

Upon being notified by emergency personnel of hazardous air quality due to the release of dangerous goods, the Manager will be instructed to shelter in place or prepare for evacuation.

To shelter in place, when notified of a release of dangerous goods, onsite staff shall close and hatch the locks on all windows, ensure all exterior doors are closed tightly, and turn off the air handling unit.

The Emergency Operations Centre from the municipality shall provide instructions to the Foundation to relay to staff, residents, their families, contractors, and suppliers.

If an evacuation is required, we will instruct all residents to gather in a specified area of the building where arranged transportation will take them to a safe area.
